



THIRD CONDITIONAL

REMEMBER!!

Conditional sentences have two parts: an **'if clause'** and a **'result'** clause.

The **'if clause'** is the part that describes the hypothetical situation that we want to speak about - "*If I had found your wallet,...*"

The **'result clause'** is the part that explains what results may come from the hypothetical 'if clause' actually happening - "*..., I would have given it back to you.*"



3RD CONDITIONAL - IMPOSSIBLE BECAUSE IT'S IN THE PAST

The Third Conditional is used to hypothesize about situations that have already happened, and therefore have a zero percent chance of becoming true.

We use this particular conditional a lot when we want to complain about or criticize something from the past.

It can also be used to give advice after something has happened, to help us learn how to deal with similar situations differently in the future.



STRUCTURE & EXAMPLES

Structure: **If + Past Perfect**, **Subject + would/could/might + Present Perfect**
Remember, we can change the order and put the result clause first. The only difference is that the comma is no longer needed. We use **'would'** when we feel **certain** about the result, **'could'** when we think it's a **possible** result, and **'might'** when we think it's a **probable** result

- *If I had had more time, I would have studied Japanese. (certain)*
- *If they had been here, they could have helped us move the furniture. (possible)*
- *She might have been angry too if she had known what happened. (probable)*
- *What would you have done if you had won the lottery? (general for questions)*
- *It wouldn't have happened if I had been more careful (negative)*
- *If you hadn't been there, they would have got lost (negative)*
