

When to use one or the other.



We use both of these words to talk about the quantities of things. 'Enough' is usually used to say 'a sufficient quantity' and 'Plenty' is usually used to say 'more than a sufficient quantity'. Have a look a the examples below before studying the grammar.

Some examples:

Mary: "OK, so there are 6 of us for dinner this

evening, is that ok?"

John: "Yes, we've got plenty of chairs!"





John: "Are you making a cake for dessert?"

Mary: "I can't, I don't have enough eggs. I'll get

some ice-cream on the way!"

Mary: "Would you like me to to get some wine, too?"

John: "No, thanks Mary, I've got plenty of wine! Could you

get some paper napkins, though? I don't think I

have enough for everyone."

Mary: "Oh, I have plenty. I'll bring some with me.





The Grammar

Enough is used as a <u>determiner</u> before a noun to show that a sufficient amount of that thing exists. We can use enough in positive and negative sentence:

- Do we have enough chairs for the dinner party?
- I don't have enough eggs to make a cake
- I have enough wine, but I don't have enough napkins.

Enough can also be used as a pronoun:

- ·No more ice-cream for me. I've had enough!
- ·The table is ready and the food is cooking, that's enough for the moment. Let's relax for half an hour.
- ·Wow John, lasagne! My favourite, I can never get enough!



Plenty is used as a quantifier & a pronoun, and means a large or sufficient quantity of something exists. We use plenty of + noun, or just plenty. We don't usually use plenty in negative sentences.

- We have plenty of wine for the party.
- I have plenty of napkins, I'll bring some over.
- I'm happy you like my lasagne, Frank. Have some more if you want, there's plenty.
