

**VOCABULARY**

To have someone over (for dinner) - means to have guests

To throw a dinner party - means to hold/host a dinner party

To lay out a feast - means to prepare a large and fantastic meal

To set the table - means to prepare the table for breakfast, lunch or dinner.

To clear the table - is what you do after a meal. Put everything in the sink / dishwasher.

MORE VOCABULARY

Cutlery - is the name used to refer to knives, forks and spoons together.

Crockery - is the name used to refer to plates, cups and other ceramics all together.

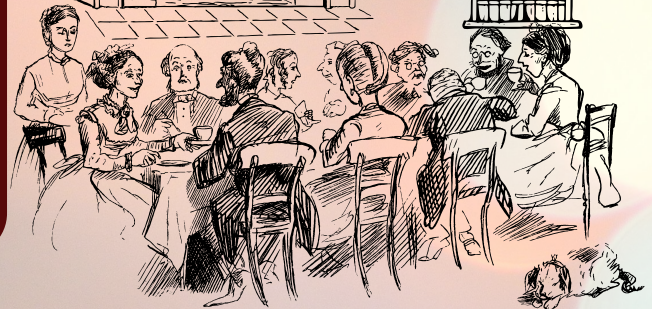
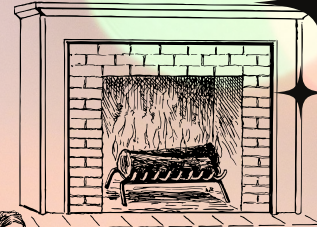
Saucer - is the small plate used under cups

Condiments - Salt, pepper and other flavourings that we usually put on food for serving.

Bland - means without flavour / 'boring', used for describing taste but also other things

Flavoursome - means something has a pleasant, distinct flavour. You can also say "Tasty"
